Handel lived at 25 Brook Street in London for 36 years and wrote many of his masterpieces here. But only the top half of the house is currently open to visitors.

The Hundred Room

This pretty, quirky room with its original 18th-century panelling and shutters offers a quiet oasis just off Bond Street. As well as a little library of music books and magazines, the room has tea and coffee making facilities and a fridge stocked with wine and beer to which guests can help themselves. There is also a laptop computer with internet connection and a printer for members to use while visiting.

Handel Hundred members can drop in, bringing as many guests as they choose, any time between 11am and 5pm Monday to Saturday to relax and enjoy feeling part of life behind the scenes at Handel House. They can also book the Hundred Room for private meetings, free of charge, between 9.30am and 11am any weekday (subject to availability).

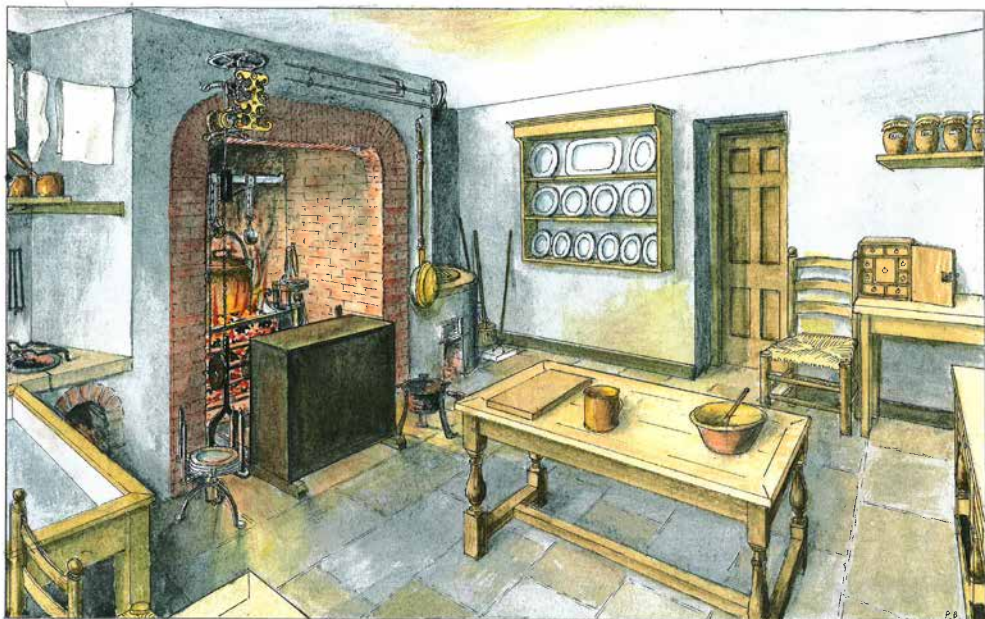

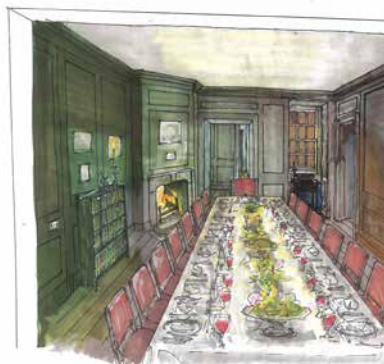
